## Key beliefs

Six articles of faith	Sunni Muslims hold six central or fundamental beliefs: Allah, Angels (Malaikah)
in Sunni Islam	Sacred Books, Risalah (prophethood), Afterlife (Akhirah) and Al-Qadr
	(Predestination). These beliefs are recorded in the teachings of the Prophet
	Muhammad in the Hadith. The Hadith is a collection of the sayings of the Prophet
	Muhammad and are revered second only in importance to the Qur'an.

Five roots in Usul ad-Din in Shi'a Islam Shi'a Muslims hold five roots (principles) as the foundation of the Islam religion: Tawhid (oneness of Allah), Adalat (God's justice), Prophethood (Nubuwwah), Leadership (Imamate) and Resurrection (Qayamat). Shi'a Muslims believe after the Prophet Muhammad died in 632CE, 12 imams were appointed to guide Muslims, of whom eleven were killed. Shi'a Muslims believe leadership of the Muslim community is from descendants of the Prophet Muhammad's family. The actions of the Prophet Muhammad are recorded in the Sunnah as an example for Muslims to follow.

Sacred texts (Kutub)

Sahifah (scrolls), Injil (Gospels), Tawrat (Torah), Zabur (Psalms) are important **revealed** and **sacred texts** but Muslims believe their original meaning has been corrupted. The scrolls are associated with **Ibrahim (Abraham)**, **the Torah (contains the Ten Commandments) with Musa (Moses)**, **the Gospels with Isa (Jesus) and the Psalms with Dawud (David)**. These **sacred texts** are believed to contain important **revelations** for the religion of Islam.
